

Comments:

The best maintained slip we surveyed. Local ferry uses beach at low tide & slipway at high tide. During holiday season used regularly for landing from recreational craft moored in Cawsand Bay. Given number of holiday lets / second homes in Kingsand/Cawsand this is probably a very active slipway in summer season. This slipway is also pedestrian access to the beach.

Wide flat beach and accessiblt slip would indicate that this is a popular slip for landing from recreational boats moored in Cawsand Bay, especially during holiday season.
